Founded in 2005 by Los Angeles natives and co-artistic directors Jackie Lopez aka Miss Funk and Leigh Foaad aka Breeze-lee, Versa-Style Dance Company was created to promote, empower and celebrate the artistry of Hip Hop and street dance culture. Named "Los Angeles' Best Dance Troupe for Hip Hop Empowerment" by LA Weekly, Versa-Style is recognized for its electrifying performances and inspiring engagement activities for schools and local communities. Consisting of committed, highly skilled street dance artists and educators representative of the diversity and beautiful complexity of Los Angeles, Versa-Style Dance Company harnesses the exhilarating energy of street dance onto the concert stage for an unforgettable evening of dance.

COMPANY BIOS



THE FOUNDERS

In 2005, Jackie Lopez, aka Miss Funk, was in the final year of pursuing her Bachelor of Arts degree at UCLA in World Arts and Cultures, with a Dance emphasis. She was creating her first repertory work, "The Perfect Song" and was recommended to work with a dancer named Leigh Foaad, aka Breeze-lee. Through this project, the two instantly bonded as collaborators, and decided to create a company together, calling it "Versa-Style," to reflect versatility within street dance, and to honor the roots, origins, beauty, and power of Hip Hop dance.

In May of 2005, Lopez and Foaad co-created their first work together, debuting their brand new company, Versa-Style, at the world famous Los Angeles dance industry showcase, "Choreographer's Carnival." In the following years, they continued to showcase at prestigious Hip Hop dance festivals such as The J.U.i.C.E. Hip Hop Dance Festival (2009, 2010, 2012 & 2014), San Francisco Hip Hop Dance Festival (2009-2012), and internationally renowned Hip Hop dance theater artist Rennie Harris' Illadelph Legends Festival (2010). Also in 2010, the company performed its first full-length theater work, "Feel Our Rhythm," at the intimate Rosenthal Theater at Inner-City Arts in Los Angeles, achieving rave reviews from audiences, inducing an encore run later in the fall. In 2011, the company produced its second full-length work, "Positive Dose," also premiering at the Rosenthal Theater.

2013 was a year of exponential growth for the company, debuting a new work, "Furious Beauty," this time in the John Anson Ford Amphitheater's Summer Series Partnership Program, selling out the theater and again garnering rave reviews. This year also saw Versa-Style grow internationally, performing in Chennai, India, as part of the city's first ever Hip Hop dance festival, as well as a seven-city tour of Israel, as part of the US Embassy Envoy program. Since that year, Versa-Style has enjoyed significant momentum, performing all over the country in Iowa, Montana, Utah, and touring



throughout Alaska, as well as continuing its international efforts, performing at the Fringe Festival in Edinburgh, Scotland, as well as in Bogota, Colombia, and Cesenatico, Italy. In 2016, Versa-Style returned to the Ford Amphitheatre to debut its latest full-length work, Box of Hope, which also premiered in 2017 at The Japanese Cultural and Community Center, as well as The Broad Stage. At the conclusion of the Box of Hope tour in 2019, Versa-Style began developing their latest production, "Freemind Freestyle" set to debut once again at the Ford Amphitheatre in Summer of 2020.



Jackie Lopez Co-Founder & Artistic Director - Organizational Wellness

Jackie Lopez aka Miss Funk is a first generation Latina Los Angeles native. She was the first in her family to graduate high school, continue her education in LA Valley College, transfer to a UC

and graduate, all due to the impact of the arts and dance in her life. Jackie graduated Summa Cum Laude from UCLA in 2004 from the Department of World Arts and Cultures, with a concentration in Dance. For the last 23 years, Jackie has been working as a professional dancer, choreographer, teaching artist and cultural educator who has worked with students and artists of all ages nationally and internationally.

Jackie is not only Versa-Style's Co-Founder/Co-Artistic Director, simultaneously Jackie is also Lecturer at UCLA's Dept. of World Arts and Cultures/Dance teaching Hip Hop dance, while also developing the Hip Hop curriculum. Jackie found love for street dance since the late 90's and she has continued to serve the Hip Hop Dance community for over 23 years. Jackie is inspired to keep Versa-Style's mission alive by using her upbringing in LAUSD, her background in arts education and passion for youth and the arts.





Leigh Foaad Co-Founder & Artistic Director - Artistic Quality and Integrity

Leigh Foaad aka Breeze-lee was exposed to dance early, which has largely contributed to his knowledge and experience among a large variety of different dance styles ranging from

classical ballet to street-dance vernacular social dances. Most notably, Leigh found his passion and skill set for a street-dance style called "Popping" in 2002. Since then, Leigh has won many national and international competitions gaining him global recognition within the dance community as a dancer, teacher, and artist.

In addition, Leigh has been working with Rennie Harris' Puremovement since 2007 and experienced being a Cultural Ambassador for the United States, touring the Middle East. He is currently a Lecturer at UCLA's Department of World Arts and Cultures/Dance teaching Hip Hop dance. Most recently, he was selected as a Hip-Hop diplomat for the NEXT LEVEL program, which is an initiative of the U.S. Dept. of State, The University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill and Meridian International Center that uses Hip Hop music, dance and art to foster cross-cultural creative exchange in diverse communities. Leigh was fortunate to travel for 2 weeks to build and exchange with the folks of the Dominican Republic. As a leader and member of Versa-Style Dance Company he is determined to express and share the knowledge and importance of hip-hop culture, while providing high intensity movement and passion for all artists around him.



Harry Weston Movement Artist & Artistic Director -Fundraising & Development

Harry Weston grew up in Santa Cruz, California, surrounded by West African dance and drumming, his first artistic inspirations. He fell in love with Hip Hop dance culture and history at the age



of 15, changing his life forever. At the age of 18, he moved to Los Angeles to study dance at UCLA where he met Jackie Lopez and Leigh Foaad, who eventually asked him to join Versa-Style in 2009. During his time in college he directed the after school Hip Hop dance team at Lincoln High School in East LA, which is now alumni-led and still thriving, and he served as Head Counselor for the UCLA Dance Theater Summer Intensive, which he now directs and is shifting to become the UCLA Hip Hop/Street Dance Summer Intensive. He has traveled the world teaching, performing and battling, but has always stayed connected to his love for Los Angeles. He remains humbled and grateful for the experiences and opportunities Hip Hop and street dance culture have provided him, and pays respect and homage to all the dancers and culture creators from the communities of color who created the dance and music he loves so much.



Alli Gray
Movement Artist & Artistic Director - Artist Wellness
Allison "Alli" Gray-Odeniyide is a dancer,
choreographer, and teaching artist based in Los
Angeles, California. Stepping onto the performing
stage at the age of five, Alli has continued to
pursue dance as her greatest life passion. While

earning her B.A. degree from UCLA's Department of World Arts and Cultures, she met inspiring teachers and mentors including Sabela Grimes, Rennie Harris, Jackie Lopez, and Leigh Foaad. At this juncture, her life pivoted when she joined Versa-Style Dance Company in 2009, falling in love with Hip Hop dance, culture, and history. Since then, Alli has enjoyed an active artist life; performing in such places as New York, San Francisco, Israel, Oregon, Alaska, India, and Scotland. In 2011, she began teaching at Torres East LA Performing Arts Magnet where she shares her passion and commitment to arts education. Here she founded Rhythm Impact, an after-school dance program dedicated to giving students access to dance training, performance opportunities, and mentorship. Based on her educational successes, Alli was selected in 2019 as the Lead Teaching Artist for Versa-Style: Performance, Education, Community to provide guidance

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and professional development for current and upcoming teaching artists.

Ernesto was one of the original members of Versa-Style Next Generation starting in 2009, but is now a Principal Dancer and Media and Marketing Manager for Versa-Style Dance Company, as well as one of the Co-Managers for Versa-Style Next Generation. He graduated from UCLA in 2015 with a major in World Arts and Cultures/Dance and a minor in Visual and Performing Arts Education. With over 17 years of experience in Hip Hop/Street Dance, Ernesto remains a student of his craft and continues to learn/train every day with the goal to pass on his knowledge and inspire the future generations.



Brandon Juezan Movement Artist & Artistic Director - Touring & Events

Brandon Allen Juezan-Williams a.k.a. "Beast Boi" first showed interest in Hip-hop dance when he was in middle school. He initially took a liking to the street dance style Krump, and was eventually

exposed to other dance styles once he reached high school. He later met Jackie Lopez at a local dance competition, who invited him and gave him a scholarship to attend the UCLA Dance/Theater Intensive in the summer of 2009. By 2010, he was a member of Versa-Style Next Generation and went on to become a professional dancer



with Versa-Style Dance Company in 2014. He is currently the Project Manager for Versa-Style Dance Company, managing bookings for the company, planning special events, budgeting, and assisting with various administrative tasks. He graduated from Cal State Fullerton in 2017 with a B.A. in Entertainment Business, and his goal is to help/mentor the dance community and families on financial literacy and how to establish strong business acumen.

Kane Smego Guest Spoken Word Artist

Kane Smego is an international touring spoken word poet and hip hop artist, educator, and National Poetry Slam finalist. He is the Associate Director and an artist alumnus of Next Level, a cultural diplomacy program that sends American

hip-hop artists around the world to use music and dance in promoting cultural exchange, artistic collaboration, and community building. Kane has performed, taught, and managed programs with youth and adults of all ages across the U.S. and abroad on five continents.

Kane's one-man show, Temples of Lung and Air, is a work of hip hop theater that premiered at Playmakers Repertory Company in 2018, was featured at the United Solo Theatre Festival in NYC in 2019, and will run as a full production at the Detroit Public Theater in Nov-Dec of this year.

As a recording artist, Kane has released multiple albums featuring his poetry and hip hop music. He also featured on Grammy Awardwinner King Mez's debut album My Everlasting Zeal, and topped the Spotify Viral 50 billboard in May 2017 featuring on the song North Cack with G Yamazawa. The music video for the song appeared on BET Jams, and went on to win Best Music Video at the Hip Hop Film Festival in Harlem, NY.

He has been a keynote speaker at various conferences, a TEDex presenter, and performed at the Shriver Report Live hosted by *Atlantic Magazine*. Kane showcased mainstage at NACA West in 2014, as a lecturer at NACA Nationals 2017, and won Best Educational Session at NACA South 2017.

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


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
